

## **Dear Caring Partner,**

If you are receiving this letter, then you are a friend, supporter, and benefactor of Note in the Pocket. I have had the honor of serving as Chairman of the Board since before its inception in 2012. As I enter the last year of my term, with almost seven years of involvement with Note in the Pocket, we look back at the filing of this annual report with great pride. The results contained herein and the growth that we have been able to achieve is entirely due to your participation, involvement and support. Without you, we cannot do what we have been able to do or achieve what we have been able to achieve. Although the need still remains greater, the progress we have made is incredibly encouraging.

Note in the Pocket provides clothing to impoverished and homeless schoolchildren in Wake County with dignity and love. We believe it is unacceptable that children are limited in their educational and social development because they do not have appropriate clothes for school. To each of you who have joined us in our mission: thank you!

The 2017/2018 Report for Wake County Public School System shows more than 50,000 (over 31%) of Wake County children qualify for free or reduced priced lunch through federal programs. Wake County is the largest school system in North Carolina and the 15th largest in the United States. Social service agencies and charitable organizations in Wake County work their hardest to make sure these children have what they need to succeed in school and in life, but they can't do everything.

We make sure that locally donated clothing goes to the children and families in our community who need it most. These are the children we serve.



We have been a 501(c)3 since 2013; within the last four years, Note in the Pocket provided clothing packages for 13,173 individuals, mostly children, throughout all 12 cities and towns in Wake County. We exceeded our goal of an additional 500 individuals each year and delivered 292,099 donated items of high quality clothing and shoes, valued at \$2,094,040. We have been successful because of wonderful volunteers, staff, referral partners, and donors.

#### Some of our 2017 highlights include:

- Our 4th Annual Socks and Undie 5K Rundie event was a great opportunity to enjoy time with our referral partners, volunteers, donors, and community supporters. We raised more than \$50,000 to support our mission.
- The Children's Society had its first full year of moving our mission forward and providing funding needed to build our capacity. We began the year with 42 members and finished the year with 81 members.
- The Teen Board and Teen Ambassador programs helped us share our mission through 23 teens from 15 different schools in five different municipalities. These teens were selected to serve as liaisons to their communities.
- To accommodate our continued growth, at the end of 2017, we also acquired additional adjacent space that expanded our Volunteer Center work and storage space to a 7,200 sq ft facility.
- The Board of Directors engaged an outside consultant to complete a program assessment to develop a strategic plan for the future of Note in the Pocket.



Our future plans include increasing our community support through item-specific, high quality, school-appropriate clothing donations, and additional volunteer manpower and funding to support the operation and growth of our program in an effort to continue to reach an additional 500 individuals each year. We are also working toward building clothing distribution centers to help increase our impact numbers locally, while developing a clothing distribution model that can eventually be replicated in other counties across North Carolina, and perhaps one day, nationally.

I have often said and will continue to say that when you give a child an education, you give a child an opportunity to succeed. What Note in the Pocket does, through our partners, is identify children in need and give them that opportunity. Thank you for giving a child a chance. We appreciate your continued support and look forward to working with you in the upcoming year when we can file another tremendous report and reflect on the good that we have achieved. I am,

## **Teen Board and Teen Ambassador Programs**

4 Others Foundation sponsored our 2017/2018 youth-based programs to develop community awareness, engage donors, increase community partnerships, and to nurture a heart for service in each participant.

To do this we carefully selected 27 passionate and articulate youth representatives from 15 different schools from five municipalities. Mentors provided them with insight about the functions and demands of running a nonprofit organization, helped them develop and hone their leadership skills, and provided guidance and support in their efforts to plan, develop, and implement projects, which improve the lives of children throughout Wake County.
