#### CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT

As Note in the Pocket celebrated our tenth anniversary in 2023, I was reminded of something once said by Isaac Newton: We stand on the shoulders of giants. We see more, and things that are more distant, than they did, not because our sight is superior or because we are taller, but because they raise us up, and by their great stature add to ours.

Serving on the Board of Directors for Note in the Pocket, I get to stand on the shoulders of giants. It started with Margaret Symonds and Susan Reiland and a single class of kindergarten students bringing home winter coats, then an ad in a church newsletter that caught the attention and inspired vision of Dallas Bonavita, and it's now grown into an incredible community of supporters, volunteers, past and present board members, and community partners.

In 2013, Note in the Pocket clothed 1,556 individuals. In 2023, we clothed 10,000 people in a single year, and surpassed 50,000 people served over the last decade.

#### That's 50,000 times...

... that a child was able to come to school because they weren't worried about standing out in the rain without a coat at the bus stop. ... that a child proudly stood up and gave a class presentation instead of slumping in the desk worried about their appearance.

... that a child made new friends at recess because they were no longer worried about running in shoes with the soles falling off.

... that a struggling parent didn't have to put less food on the table in order to afford a winter coat.

That's 50,000 lives that have been permanently, positively changed thanks to Note in the Pocket—thanks to you, our community of supporters.

As we celebrate all of the good that Note in the Pocket has done in our community this last year and last decade, the challenge and obligation today is to consider how we can give the biggest, broadest possible shoulders for others to stand upon. Imagine what the 20th or 25th anniversary of Note in the Pocket might look like... and then, let's do whatever we can to ensure the brightest possible future of life-changing impact for this incredible organization.





Note in the Pocket's community partners are our lifeline to the individuals who need our Mini-Wardrobes. They work at schools, agencies, and non-profits on the frontlines of supporting families in difficult situations where clothing insecurity is an underlying issue. Here are two stories from local social workers who experience the impact firsthand.

#### Kathy, Public School System

✓ athy has seen it all as a social worker with the public school system for almost 30 years. At home visits and assessments, she often observes families experiencing clothing insecurity. She has turned to Note in the Pocket to meet these needs since the organization's early years.

"The families I refer are very impoverished," Kathy explains. "Many are experiencing homelessness or leaving domestic violence situations from out of state. They don't have the finances to clothe their children."

Kathy loves that Note in the Pocket is able to clothe the whole family - students, working parents, and babies. She has the chance to deliver the clothing and enjoy each person's reaction.

"Note in the Pocket makes sure the children are truly loved by picking out age-appropriate, relevant clothes" she said. "They keep a pulse on what's trendy and the right sizing. The children feel very special."

"I love what I do, and Note in the Pocket makes it even more of a pleasure to serve families. They are well known in the community and do a great job of coordinating with other agencies and nonprofits."

#### **Stephany, Lucy Daniels Center**

tephany is a trained therapist and clinical Social worker with the Lucy Daniels Center, which provides mental health services for children ages birth to 5. These children are dealing with events like divorce or death or have behavioral issues. Many have recently moved from other countries and start preschool while their parents look for work.

"We experience what it means to be at home and see the clinical and basic needs, as well as where the families struggle," said Stephany. "Clothes are a big deal for children at this age because they're growing out of things and developing so quickly."

Stephany remembers a case where a child was released from immigration detention and had no clothes, and Note in the Pocket was able to provide a Mini-Wardrobe in just two days.

"Note in the Pocket works really hard to get things going for the family," she said. "If the child has clothes they're proud to wear, or with their favorite color or character, it makes a difference in how they go out in the world. The change is pretty immediate."


In 2023 we were thrilled to announce the next step in our growth... a new program location in Durham! We also found the perfect place, signed the lease and upfitted the space for our unique needs.

# **VOLUNTEERS**

Volunteers play a significant role in our ability to clothe children with dignity and love. In 2023 we had 105 volunteers serve 1-3 times weekly, 120 volunteers serve once a month and 10 corporate and civic groups serve at least monthly.
